



### 11 Submarine Industrial Base Suppliers

The <u>OREGON</u> submarine industrial base has received approximately <u>\$54,485,375.78</u> in purchase order awards, which provided highly skilled, high-wage manufacturing jobs producing specialized components and materials. These products include:

- Composites
- Testing Instruments
- Foodservice Equipment

- Computer Products
- Machining & Welding Systems
- Specialty Pipe Fittings



Funding listed is the total amount spent or contracted to submarine suppliers over the past five years for major submarine programs. It does not include funding for the two submarine suppliers. While the maps offer a good representation of the economic impact submarine programs have on communities, it is estimated that thousands of additional lower tier suppliers exist across the U.S. that are not represented.


