



## 7 Submarine Industrial Base Suppliers

The <u>WEST VIRGINIA</u> submarine industrial base has recieved approximately <u>\$28,659,162.72</u> in purchase order awards which provided highly skilled, high-wage manufacturing jobs producing specialized components and materials. These products include:

- High Strength Fasteners
- Shipboard Fire Control Equipment

- Corrosion Resistant Alloys
- Industrial Chemicals



Funding listed is the total amount spent or contracted to submarine suppliers over the past five years for major submarine programs. While the maps offer a good representation of the economic impact submarine programs have on communities, it is estimated that thousands of additional lower tier suppliers exist across the U.S. that are not represented.




